Students should concentrate on writing their thoughts and observations as they read. Students are not required to write in their journals daily; they are encouraged to make comments after reading several chapters. Journals will be due during the first full week of school. Journals will replace the written test on summer reading. All students should check with their literature teachers regarding specific requirements for the journals, how many entries, what form journals should take, etc.

AP students should check with their teacher for any additional requirements that might be involved with an AP course.
